

The War!	The Americas	Thrills and Spills
<p><u>Geography</u> Children will discover the reasons leading up to the outbreak of WW2, and which countries were involved, either with the Allies or Axis Powers. They will look in detail at the effects of the war on different sections of society, and how some of these had a long-term effect on our culture and economy. They will also research events leading up to, and involved in, the end of WW2, the surrender of countries and the death of Hitler.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> A Study of a non- European society that provides contrasts with British history – Mayan civilisation 2000 BC - AD 900. A region within North or South America. Children will study the territories of the Ancient Maya civilisation in Central America. As much of the region is covered by tropical rainforest (biome), they will learn about this and the creatures which inhabit it. Children will begin to learn about past and current changes to the rainforests, and how the future of tropical rainforests and other ecosystems is closely connected to human lives and lifestyles. They will also learn about the wider countries of Mexico, Guatemala, Belize, Honduras and El Salvador, in which the rainforests exist.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> Human Geography, Land Use, economic Activity, OS Mapwork. Children will study the human and physical geography of a seaside town, such as Blackpool in Lancashire, comparing it with other places studied previously. They will consider elements such as tourism, transport, settlements, land use and change over time etc through the use of maps, images and other sources of geographical information. They will develop Ordnance Survey and digital mapping skills. There may be a possibility of doing some fieldwork.</p>
<p><u>History</u> Children will study an aspect of British history beyond 1066, which was a significant turning point in British history.</p>	<p><u>History</u> Children will study the achievements of one of the earliest non-European civilisations. As well as dealing in facts, and selecting and organising relevant sources of historical information, they will try to reach their own informed conclusions about what happened to the mighty Maya civilisation.</p>	<p><u>History</u> Children will study the development of leisure and entertainment in Blackpool, a major tourist resort on Britain’s west coast.</p>

Greeks	Water, Water Everywhere	Yorkshire
<p><u>Geography</u> Children will discover the lasting influence of the Ancient Greeks on the Western world. They will place events and people on a timeline, and marvel at Alexander the Great and the expansion of the Greek Empire under his leadership. They will learn about trading and designs, research and compare the different cultures of Athens and Sparta, and study Ancient Greek buildings.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> This study will inspire children with a curiosity and fascination about the world and its people. It will help them to appreciate that water is central to the survival of all mankind, and will give them an appreciation of how everyone is entitled to this most precious resource and the need to use it with care.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u> In this unit of work, children will learn in-depth about the county in which they live, and beyond. They will see how the interaction between physical and human processes affects changes in the natural environment, with far-reaching consequences.</p>
<p><u>History</u> In order to give pupils a coherent knowledge and understanding of the past within the context of the wider world, children will study Greek life and achievements and their legacy on the western world. They should be able to identify the ways in which our current lifestyles, architecture, political system and sporting events have been significantly influenced by the Ancient Greeks.</p>		<p><u>History</u> We will be studying the county of Yorkshire, its natural history and its industrial history, particularly mining and farming. We will also look at the more current developments such as the Tour de Yorkshire, as we study its landscape and many attractions.</p>
